

DRESS CODE
(Board Policy #221)

Examples of inappropriate dress include, but are not limited to the following:

- Hats, caps, bandannas, and sunglasses worn in the building (all head apparel)
Note: Sunglasses must not be worn except with prior administrative permission. Under this circumstance, students must carry written authorization with them at all times.
- Jeans with holes without patches on them. Low-riding baggy jeans and shorts, Articles of clothing that reference drugs, alcohol, tobacco products, obscenities, sexual connotations, or that contains a statement which is derogatory to any racial, ethnic or religious group Clothing depicting violence. Clothing or insignia related to gangs, racist or hate
- Coats or jackets during the school day
- Soiled or torn clothing
- Chains hanging from pants, heavy chains, dog chains, choker collars and excessive beads
- Tank tops, halter tops, tube tops, cutoff shirts, crop shirts, sheer tops, mesh tops, bare midriffs, bare backs, muscle shirts, half-shirts, see-through blouses or that reveal an undergarment. Undershirts and under-shorts as outer garments
- Garments worn in such a manner as to expose
- Shorts, skirts, dresses must be mid thigh when seated
- Tight-fitted clothing
- Articles of clothing made of Spandex or cut-off shorts
- Tattoos displaying messages with implication of a sexual nature, obscenities, suggestive remarks, negative comments about another culture, or reference to illegal substances may not be visibly displayed and must remain under appropriate clothing.

In addition to the above, the administration reserves the right to make a decision regarding the appropriateness of student dress.

When a student's dress presents a danger to his/her health and safety or creates a distraction to the learning process, the student will be requested to make changes. Violation of the dress code will result in disciplinary action.

Special Circumstances:

For the safety and welfare of everyone, teachers may limit the kind of clothing that may be worn by students in classes such as Physical Education, Science laboratories, Consumer Science and shop classes
